James Webb Space Telescope Named after beryllos, the Greek name for the mineral beryl from which it was discovered

Louis Nicolas Vauquelin discovered Beryllium from beryl and a green-colored variety of beryl, emerald in its oxide form. The metal was isolated by two chemists, Friedrich Wölhler from Germany and Antoine Bussy from France independently in 1828. Beryllium is classified as a carcinogen and it can cause lung cancer in people who get exposed to beryllium on a daily basis. Despite this, it is highly useful because of its unique qualities:- one of the lightest metals and has one of the highest melting points among the light metals
